



Primary Care

The Florida Department of Health in Pinellas County and Pinellas County Government collaborate to provide primary care to uninsured adult clients at five of our county health care locations (no services at 130th Ave. in Largo). **Our locations are open from 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.**

Clients who qualify are provided with these services:

- Primary care, including lab work
- Wellness and prevention services, including annual physicals
- Prescriptions
- Cancer screenings
- Nutrition education and counseling
- Behavioral health screenings and referrals
- Dental services
- Specialty care referrals

Pinellas also offers primary care services on a sliding fee scale to clients that do not qualify for no-cost services.

Preventing Disease and Promoting Good Health

Did you know that heart disease, cancer, and stroke are the leading causes of death in adults in our community? The good news is that many of the risk factors associated with these chronic diseases-such as tobacco use, improper nutrition, and lack of physical activity-may be eliminated through living a healthier lifestyle.

Family Wellness Support

Along with community partners, we provide:

- Primary care services for the uninsured
- Family planning services and consultation
- Sexually transmitted infection testing and treatment
- Breast and cervical cancer screenings

Maternal and Child Health

- Parenting resources through home visits
- Interconceptional (between babies) care services for mothers
- Mental health counseling and support services
- Community referrals
- Resources and information for families, such as infant safe sleeping

Supplemental Nutrition Program for Womens, Infants, and Children (WIC)

Assists eligible pregnant, breastfeeding, and postpartum women, infants, and children up to age five, by providing:

- Healthy foods
- Nutrition guidance
- Breastfeeding support

Dental Health

Services provided for adult and pediatric dental care:

- Exams and x-rays
- Cleanings
- Restorations
- Extractions
- Sealants
- Emergency treatments

School Health Services

Offered in Pinellas County Schools, ranging from basic health services to student clinics. Services are provided at Northeast, Boca Ciega, Gibbs, and Pinellas Park high schools.

School-Based Dental Sealants

Provides dental sealants to Pinellas County children in more than 40 elementary schools.

Disease Control

Provide community support to ensure communicable (infectious) diseases are reported and investigate cause of infection to protect public health.

Prevention and treatment services for:

- Tuberculosis (TB)
- Sexually transmitted infections
- Hepatitis A, B, and C
- HIV/AIDS
- Other infectious diseases

Immunizations

DOH-Pinellas offers immunizations for children at no cost. Adult immunizations and those required for travel are also available.

Birth and Death Certificates
