Life Enhancement Activity Program (LEAP)- Community based program that uses the role recovery principles of psychosocial rehabilitation. Substance Abuse or Mental Health- The Department provides treatment for substance use disorder through a community-based provider system that offers detoxification, treatment and recovery support for adolescents and adults affected by substance misuse or dependence. Detoxification Services: Detoxification focuses on the elimination of substance use. Specifically, detoxification services utilize medical and clinical procedures to assist individuals and adults as they withdraw from the physiological and psychological effects of substance use. Detoxification may occur in either a residential or outpatient setting, depending on the needs of the individual. Treatment Services: Treatment services include a wide array of assessment, counseling, case management, and support provided in residential and non-residential (outpatient) settings. Treatment services are designed to help individuals and their families who have lost their abilities to control the substance use on their own and require formal, structured intervention and support. Services include various levels of residential, outpatient, and recovery support based on the severity of the addiction. Research indicates that persons who successfully complete substance use treatment have better post-treatment outcomes related to future abstinence, reduced use, less involvement in the criminal justice system, reduced involvement in the child-protective system, employment, increased earnings, and better health. Recovery Support- Recovery Support is offered during and following treatment to further assist individuals in their development of the knowledge and skills necessary to maintain their recovery. These services include transitional housing, life skills training, parenting skills, and peer-based individual and group counseling. Florida's State Opioid Response Project- Florida's State Opioid Response Project (SOR) is administered through the Office of Substance Abuse and Mental Health (SAMH) in the Florida Department of Children and Families. SOR is funded by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), and is designed to address the opioid crisis and reduce opioid-related deaths by providing a comprehensive array of evidence-based prevention, medication-assisted treatment (MAT), and recovery support services. Treatment and recovery services target indigent, uninsured, and underinsured individuals with opioid use disorders or opioid misuse. Additionally, SOR funds are used to expand the Department's Overdose Prevention Program which distributes and trains on the use of naloxone (Narcan®), the life-saving medication that reverses opioid overdoses; and assists community-based organizations with the development of standing orders, policies, and protocols for community distribution and training. Certified Recovery Peer Specialist Services, TRACE (Telehealth Remote Access to Crisis Evaluation): T.R.A.C.E. is a pilot program that allows Law Enforcement Officers to have immediate access to DFL Counselors while in the field responding to our community's emergency calls. CABHI (Cooperative Agreements to Benefit Homeless Individuals): provide individual, family, and couples counseling services to individuals living homeless. We provide linkage to care coordination and psychiatric services as needed. SOAR- This program is designed to increase access to SSI/SSDI for adults who are experiencing or are at-risk of homelessness and have a mental illness, medical impairment, and/or a co-occurring substance use disorder. Family Services- Operation PAR's sensitive, qualified counselors will help you and your family learn what your loved one is experiencing while in treatment services. <u>Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT)</u>- For individuals addicted to opiates (pain pills, heroin, Oxycotin, etc.) Operation PAR's MAPS have a proven track record for improving the quality of life for patients. We offer Methadone Maintenance, Methadone Detox, Buprenorphine Maintenance and Detox, and other medication assisted treatments. <u>Outpatient Services</u>- Operation PAR's outpatient services provide youth and adults with opportunities to address substance use disorders, mental health conditions, and other concerns in an outpatient setting. Through outpatient treatment, Operation PAR also provides therapeutic services that include group counseling and random drug screening to prevent relapse. Effective outpatient treatment requires that you do not need medical detoxification and that you do have a stable living and work/school environment. Outpatient services by Operation PAR cover a variety of mental, physical, and emotional health needs. <u>Residential Treatment</u>- Length of stay may vary. Individuals may take part in a menu of services, including the continuing care program, onsite Pinellas County High School and Vocational education, drug screen monitoring, Case Management, Behavioral Modification and Anger Management, Recreation and Art Therapy, Individual and Gender-Specific Group Counseling, Screening and Diagnostic Assessment. Admission is based on individual clinical needs, overseen by a Board-Certified psychiatrist. <u>Medical Detox</u>- During inpatient detoxification, patients stay at our facilities until the process is complete. Along with a physical health screening, Operation PAR's inpatient detoxification program includes a psychosocial assessment, medically monitored detoxification, and stabilization for individual's dependent on drugs and alcohol who meet the admission criteria.
